MINUTES
REGULAR CITY COUNCIL MEETING – May 18th, 2023

1. The Mountain Home City Council met in regular session May 18th, 2023, in the Council Chambers of the Municipal Building. Mayor Hillrey Adams called the meeting to order at 6 p.m.
2. **ROLL CALL** Following the Pledge of Allegiance, the following Council members were present for the roll call: Bob Van Haaren, Susan Stockton, Jennifer Baker, Wayne Almond, Paige Evans, Carry Manuel, and Jim Bodenhamer. Council member Nick Reed was absent.
3. **OFFICIALS IN ATTENDANCE** Mayor Hillrey Adams, City Clerk Scott Liles, City Attorney Roger Morgan, Planning Director Arnold Knox, Building Inspector Greg Ifland, Fire Chief Kris Quick, Parks Director Daniel Baxley and Code Enforcement Officer Mike Anderson. *Media present: Alison Fulton (Mountain Home Observer).*
4. **IN MEMORIAM** City Attorney Roger Morgan opened the meeting by noting the recent deaths of two former elected officials: City Clerk Debbie House and Mayor David Osmon.
5. **MINUTES** Council member Jennifer Baker made a motion to approve the minutes from April 20th, 2023, meeting. The motion was seconded by council member Bob Van Haaren. *The vote was recorded as follows: All present – yes, Absent – Nick Reed.*
6. **NEW BUSINESS**
AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 296, AS AMENDED, WITH REFERENCE TO ZONING WITHIN THE CITY LIMITS OF THE CITY OF MOUNTAIN HOME, ARKANSAS, RELATIVE TO CHANGING AREA ZONED AS RESIDENTIAL R-1 TO COMMERCIAL C-2A This ordinance would rezone property located at the corner of Roberts Drive and Highway 62/412 W from Residential R-1 to Commercial C-2A. The ordinance was presented by Ted Sanders.

SECOND READING After City Attorney Roger Morgan read the proposed ordinance in full, council member Bob Van Haaren made a motion to suspend the rules and place the item on its second reading by title only. Council member Jennifer Baker seconded the motion. *The vote was recorded as follows: All present – yes, and the motion carried.*

THIRD READING Following the ordinance's second reading by title only, council member Bob Van Haaren made the motion to suspend the rules and place the item on its third reading by title only. This motion was seconded by council member Susan Stockton. *The vote was recorded as follows: All present – yes, and the motion carried.*

ADOPTION After the third reading by title only, council member Bob Van Haaren made the motion to adopt the proposed ordinance. His motion was seconded by council

member Susan Stockton. *The vote was recorded as follows: All present – yes, and the ordinance was declared adopted and numbered Ordinance No. 2023-20.*

7. DISCUSSION ON THE PARTNERSHIP BETWEEN NORTH ARKANSAS TRANSPORTATION SERVICES (NATS) AND THE CITY OF MOUNTAIN HOME

NATS Deputy Director Jeremy Ragland and Transportation Director Jack Chisum attend the meeting and presented this item on the ongoing partnership between the City and the transportation provider.

Under the agreement, the City pays NATS \$1,250 a month to provide no-cost transportation services to Mountain Home residents. Since Dec. 1, 2022, NATS has provided 2,675 trips to residents thru the program. That number includes 450 passengers in December, a total of 413 passengers in January, a total of 465 passengers in February, a total of 644 passengers in March and a total of 703 passengers in April.

The City and NATS had been operating under a series of three-month plans, and Jack Chisum asked the Council to consider extending the City's agreement with the transporter through the end of the year.

Council member Jennifer Baker made a motion to extend the City's existing operating agreement with NATS through the end of December 2023, at which time the Council will once again review the agreement. Her motion was seconded by council member Jim Bodenhamer. *The vote was recorded as follows: All present – yes, the motion carried, and the agreement was extended through the end of the 2023 calendar year.*

8. DISCUSSION TO AWARD ONE HALF OF THE PENSION OF THE LATE DEBORAH HOUSE TO HER HUSBAND, RONNIE PYLE, UNDER A.C.A. 24-12-121

Under A.C.A. 24-12-121, the City Council may, at its discretion, award one-half of the pension of the late City Clerk Debbie House to her husband, Ronnie Pyle.

After a brief discussion on the issue, the Council decided to table this item until its June 1 meeting so Treasury Director Alma Clark could be present to answer some questions council members had on the issue.

9. A RESOLUTION EXPRESSING THE WILLINGNESS OF THE CITY OF MOUNTAIN HOME TO UTILIZE FEDERAL-AID RECREATIONAL TRAILS PROGRAM FUNDS

If adopted, this resolution would affirm the City's use of federal funds to make improvements to McCabe Park. Planned items that would be funded from the federal money include parking lot improvements, more lighting, restroom facilities and greater handicap accessibility.

After City Attorney Roger Morgan read the resolution aloud, council member Bob Van Haaren made the motion to adopt the resolution and was seconded by council member Susan Stockton. *The vote was recorded as follows: All present – yes, the motion carried, and the resolution declared adopted and numbered Resolution No. 2023-7.*

10. REQUEST TO SELL SURPLUS LIGHT POLES TO THE CITY OF CALICO ROCK

Mayor Hillrey Adams presented this item, which involved the City of Calico Rock desiring to purchase surplus light poles from the City of Mountain Home for a sum of \$1,500. The surplus

poles are not true light poles per se, they are instead street light poles that have been reformatted for use as light poles.

Council member Bob Van Haaren made a motion to sell the surplus poles to Calico Rock and was seconded by council member Paige Evans. *The vote was recorded as follows: All present – yes, the motion carried, and permission was granted to sell the light poles to the City of Calico Rock.*

11. AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 296 AND ORDINANCE NO. 90-23 FOR THE PURPOSE OF SETTING FILING FEES FOR PETITIONS TO THE PLANNING COMMISSION AND CITY COUNCIL FOR REZONINGS, SPECIAL USE VARIANCES AND ANNEXATIONS, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

If approved, this ordinance would update the fees the City charged for rezonings, annexations and special use variances. The City's existing fees for these items were set in 1990 and the city has been paying out more in publication costs for those items than what it collected in fees. The updated rates would be \$200 for rezonings and special use variances and \$250 for annexations.

SECOND READING After City Attorney Roger Morgan read the proposed ordinance in full, council member Jennifer Baker made the motion to suspend the rules and place the item on its second reading by title only. That motion drew a second from council member Carry Manuel. *The vote was recorded as follows: All present – yes, and the motion carried.*

THIRD READING Following the ordinance's second reading by title only, council member Jennifer Baker made a motion to suspend the rules and place the item on its third reading by title only. Her motion was seconded by council member Susan Stockton. *The vote was recorded as follows: All present – yes, and the motion carried.*

ADOPTION After the third reading, council member Jennifer Baker made a motion to adopt the ordinance and was seconded by council member Bob Van Haaren. *The vote was recorded as follows: All present – yes, and the ordinance was declared adopted and numbered Ordinance No. 2023-21.*

EMERGENCY CLAUSE After Ordinance No. 2023-21 was declared adopted, council member Jennifer Baker made a motion to attach the City's emergency clause to the item. That motion was seconded by Bob Van Haaren. *The vote was recorded as follows: All present – yes, and the emergency clause was declared attached to Ordinance No. 2023-21.*

12. AN ORDINANCE WAIVING COMPETITIVE BIDDING AND AUTHORIZING THE PURCHASE OF A 2023 RAM 5500 4x4 CREW CAB CHASSIS WITH A WORK BED AND A 7,500-POUND CRANE WITH A 30-FOOT REACH

If approved, this ordinance would waive the city's regular bidding procedure to purchase a RAM 5500 pickup and associated equipment from Red River Dodge of Heber Springs for a sum not to exceed \$200,000. The City has

been trying for some time to purchase a RAM 5500, but has not had any luck in finding one available for purchase.

SECOND READING After City Attorney Roger Morgan read the proposed ordinance in full, council member Bob Van Haaren made a motion to suspend the rules and place the item on its second reading by title only. His motion was seconded by council member Jennifer Baker. *The vote was recorded as follows: All present – yes, and the motion carried.*

THIRD READING Following the ordinance’s second reading by title only, council member Bob Van Haaren made a motion to suspend the rules and place the item on its third reading by title only. Council member Jennifer Baker seconded the motion. *The vote was recorded as follows: All present – yes, and the motion carried.*

ADOPTION After the item’s third reading, council member Bob Van Haaren made a motion to adopt the ordinance. His motion was seconded by council member Jennifer Baker. *The vote was recorded as follows: All present – yes, and the ordinance was declared adopted and numbered Ordinance No. 2023-22.*

EMERGENCY CLAUSE Following adoption, council member Jennifer Baker made a motion to attach the City’s emergency clause to Ordinance No. 2023-22. Council member Bob Van Haaren seconded that motion. *The vote was recorded as follows: All present – yes, and the emergency clause was declared attached to Ordinance No. 2023-22.*

13. APPROVAL OF CONSTRUCTION MANAGER FOR THE SHARP FAMILY FIRE STATION

Mayor Hillrey Adams reported that the city met with representatives from four construction firms on June 15 to consider selecting a construction manager for the planned Sharp Family Fire Station. After meeting with all four companies, the City’s panel has recommended Gregory Construction of Mountain Home to serve as the station’s construction manager, the mayor said.

Council member Bob Van Haaren made a motion for the city to contract with Gregory Construction as construction manager for the Sharp Family Fire Station and was seconded by council member Susan Stockton. *The vote was recorded as follows: All – yes, the motion carried.*

14. MAYOR’S COMMENTS Mayor Hillrey Adams shared with council members a thank-you letter penned by Wynne Mayor Jennifer Hobbs. The City of Mountain Home recently dispatched two crews of employees to Wynne to assist in tornado-recovery efforts there. The mayor also reported that crews are currently “scratching” dirt at the site of the future community center and aquatic facility in McCabe Park. The City hopes to put out requests for construction bids in July, he said.

15. ADJOURN

With no further business to come before the council, Mayor Hillrey Adams declared the meeting adjourned at 6:43 p.m.

Street Committee Meeting
May 16, 2023 – 12:30 p.m.

The meeting was called to order at 12:30 p.m.

Present were Scott Manchester, Assistant Director of Streets; Jim Bodenhamer, Susan Stockton, Paige Evans and Jennifer Baker, Committee members.

The Street Report for April 2023 was reviewed.

Scott reported that the Russell Lane rebuild project has a cost of \$652,841.99. Bids will be opened Thursday, May 18 for the asphalt contract and the low bidder will have 30 days to complete their job. He added, landscaping will be finished by the end of the month.

The Access Road project that will lead to the new Community and Aquatic Center at McCabe Park has a cost of \$ 82,251.98. Scott reported the building plans have been received, and the Maintenance crew broke ground on the new gymnasium last Wednesday. This area will be dug out to where the contractors will begin their work. He told the Committee a gate has been put up to keep the public out of the area while construction is going on.

Construction of a 3 bay box culvert is going well at the Bike Path Phase 2. The crew is at the bypass getting this box ready and there will be an additional 2 – 5 bay box culverts to pour after this one is completed. When the three boxes are completed, the crew will get back to working on the bike path. Scott reported \$84,972.36 will be applied toward the \$164,000 ARDOT Grant for the Bike Path. Total dollars spent to date is \$170,370.97.

Scott reported the total cost spent for crews to assist Wynne, Arkansas with their tornado damage was \$52,864.05. He reminded the Committee that Arnie and a crew of six left for Wynne on April 1, returned on April 7, then another crew of six left on April 10 and returned on April 13.

Maintenance for the month of April is \$17,480.41. This includes trimming limbs, mowing the right of ways, sign maintenance, cleaning culverts, etc.

The Budget Summary was reviewed.

Scott reported General Fund had been invoiced \$181,042.86, the balance of what is owed for the work done at Clysta Willett Park. The Fire Department has reimbursed the Street Department \$71,869.17 for work that was done at their new location, and the Police Department has reimbursed \$2,315 for the canine pad that was poured at Carlile Highlands.

Work has been completed at 62 and Club Boulevard modifying it to have a dedicated left turn signal both east and west bound. All but 10% of the invoice totaling \$30,122.13 was paid, holding that 10% to make sure there are no problems with the signal.

The meeting was adjourned at 12:51 p.m.

- **Our water loss was 24.2% Ending APRIL 2023. The previous month was at 25.8%. We continue to fix and find leaks daily as these leaks present themselves.**
- **Johnny gave updates on satellite imagery that will be being done at the last part of June or first part of July 2023. Should have results shortly after to determine what and where to fix leak issues.**
- **Kirby passed out copies of Garver project updates to the W/S Committee that are in progress: WWTP upgrades & additional upgrades at WWTP, New Lake intake project, Master Plan Updates.**

PROJECT UPDATES:

- **Dyer St. phase II Sewer Line Upgrade: Started on 12/19/2022. Total footage to be upgraded is 2900' of pipe and 21 manholes to be replaced. To date we have laid 1078' of SDR 26 pipe and have set 6 manholes and 1 bore has been completed. Remaining to be laid is 1822' and 15 manholes. ON HOLD working on Conway Right now.**
- **Conway Sewer Line upgrade: Started on 02/21/2023. We will be replacing approximately 540' of 8" on Conway from Columbia to Arkansas Ave. To date we have laid 336'. Remaining to complete is 204'.**
- **Morris St / N Church Water Line Upgrade: Started 03/23/23. Total footage that will be redone on church St is 786' of 8". On Morris St 705' of 6" water line. To date we have laid all of the pipe & done two bores on Morris St; remaining to be done is clean up 4 services and placement of 1 fire hydrant. We will be moving to N Church Street to start WL on this portion soon.**

Morris St / N Church Sewer Line Upgrade: Started _____. Total footage that will be redone on Church St is 697' of 8" and 2 manholes. On Morris St 904' & 3 manholes.



AR - Arkansas Code Annotated **Title 24 Retirement And Pensions** **Chapter 12 Local Officers And Employees – Miscellaneous Provisions** **Subchapter 1 – General Provisions**

24-12-121. City clerk — Clerk-treasurer.

(a)

(1) A city clerk or clerk-treasurer in a city of the first class may retire from office for the remainder of his or her life at the retirement pay provided in this section if the person has served as city clerk, clerk-treasurer, or city treasurer for:

(A) Not less than ten (10) years, upon reaching sixty (60) years of age; or

(B) Twenty (20) years, without regard to age.

(2) On January 1 of each year, if a retiree under this section has been retired for at least twelve (12) full months, up to a three percent (3%) cost-of-living increase will be added.

(3) Subdivision (a)(2) of this section applies only if approved by the governing body of the city.

(b)

(1) Any city clerk, city treasurer, or any person serving as city clerk or clerk-treasurer who shall retire or be succeeded by another city clerk or clerk-treasurer within the provisions of this section shall be paid monthly a sum equal to one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of the monthly salary received by him or her during the last preceding year of his or her service.

(2) The retirement pay shall be paid by the city from its general fund account.

(c)

(1) Any city clerk or clerk-treasurer in a city of the first class who has served in another capacity with the same city, and that capacity of service also provides for a retirement plan, may apply all years served in that previous capacity toward the accrual of the vesting period provided for in subsection (a) of this section, if approved by the city council.

(2) Benefits shall be paid proportionally from the various funds applicable to the respective capacities of service. This shall be based on the length of service in each capacity for the city.

(d)

(1) Upon the death of any city clerk or clerk-treasurer who retired under the provisions of subsection (a) of this section or any other state statute or any city clerk or clerk-treasurer who dies in office after becoming eligible to retire under subsection (a) of this section or any other state statute, the legally recognized spouse of the city clerk or clerk-treasurer married to the city clerk or clerk-treasurer ten (10) years or longer may receive, at the option of the governing body of the city, one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of the retirement benefit the retired city clerk or clerk-treasurer was receiving or one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of the retirement benefit the city clerk or clerk-treasurer who died in office was entitled to receive.

(2) Upon remarriage of the spouse, the benefits shall cease.
