NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

Notice is hereby given pursuant to Arkansas Code Annotated Section 19-9-607 (2016 Repl.) that a public hearing will be held before the Mayor of the City of Mountain Home, Arkansas (the "City") on the question of the adoption of an ordinance authorizing the issuance by the City of not to exceed \$10,000,000 in aggregate principal amount of Water and Sewer Revenue Improvement Bonds, Series 2022 (the "Series 2022 Bonds"), under the authority of Amendment 65 to the Constitution of the State of Arkansas and Arkansas Code Annotated Sections 14-164-401 *et seq.* (1998 Repl. & 2021 Supp.). The Series 2022 Bonds shall be payable from and secured by the revenues derived from the City's water and sewer system (the "System"). The proceeds of the proposed Series 2022 Bonds will be used (i) to finance the costs of upgrading and improving the City's wastewater treatment plant (the "Project"), (ii) to purchase a policy of municipal bond insurance, if deemed economically advantageous, (iii) to fund a debt service reserve or to purchase a policy of debt service reserve insurance, if deemed economically advantageous, and (iv) to pay the costs of issuing the Series 2022 Bonds.

Any persons interested may appear and express their views, both orally and in writing, on the proposed issuance of the Series 2022 Bonds and on the nature of the Project at a public hearing to be held at 5:45 p.m. on Thursday, May 19, 2022, in the Council Chamber of the Municipal Building, 720 South Hickory Street, Mountain Home, Arkansas. Any remarks at the hearing will be limited to five minutes per person. At such hearing, all suggestions and objections will be heard and considered.







ORDINANCE NO. ____

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF \$10,000,000 OF WATER AND SEWER REVENUE IMPROVEMENT BONDS, SERIES 2022, BY THE CITY OF MOUNTAIN HOME, ARKANSAS FOR THE PURPOSE OF FINANCING THE UPGRADING AND IMPROVING OF THE CITY'S WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT; AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF A FIFTH SUPPLEMENTAL TRUST INDENTURE PURSUANT TO WHICH THE BONDS WILL BE ISSUED AND SECURED; AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF A BOND PURCHASE AGREEMENT PROVIDING FOR THE SALE OF THE BONDS; AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF AN OFFICIAL STATEMENT PURSUANT TO WHICH THE BONDS WILL BE OFFERED; AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF A CONTINUING DISCLOSURE AGREEMENT PROVIDING FOR THE ONGOING DISCLOSURE OF CERTAIN INFORMATION REGARDING THE CITY AND THE SYSTEM: PRESCRIBING OTHER MATTERS RELATING THERETO; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City of Mountain Home, Arkansas (the "City"), a city of the first class, presently owns and operates a combined water and sewer utility system (the "System") serving the residents of the City and surrounding areas; and

WHEREAS, the City is authorized and empowered under the provisions of the Constitution and laws of the State of Arkansas, including particularly Amendment 65 and Arkansas Code Annotated Sections 14-164-401 *et seq.* (Repl. 1998 & 2021 Supp.) (as from time to time amended, the "Act") to issue and sell its water and sewer revenue bonds for the purpose of financing and refinancing the cost of improvements to the System; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Constitution, the Act and Ordinance No. 2017-16 adopted on September 21, 2017, the City has previously issued and there are presently outstanding its Water and Sewer Revenue Refunding Bonds, Series 2017 (the "Series 2017 Bonds"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Constitution, the Act and Ordinance No. 2020-41 adopted on October 1, 2020, the City has previously issued and there are presently outstanding its Water and Sewer Revenue Refunding Bonds, Series 2020 (the "Series 2020 Bonds"); and

WHEREAS, the City has determined the need to upgrade and improve its existing wastewater treatment plant (the "Project") for use in the operation of the System, which upgrading and rehabilitation will benefit the City and its residents; and

WHEREAS, in order to secure funds necessary to finance the Project, to purchase policies of municipal bond insurance and municipal bond debt service reserve insurance, and to pay printing, legal, underwriting and other expenses incidental to the issuance of water and sewer revenue bonds for such purposes, the City has now determined to issue its Water and Sewer Revenue Improvement Bonds, Series 2022, in the aggregate principal amount of \$10,000,000 (the "Series 2022 Bonds"); and

WHEREAS, the City has determined to issue and secure the Series 2022 Bonds pursuant to a Trust Indenture dated as of March 15, 2013, as previously supplemented and amended by a First Supplemental Trust Indenture dated as of September 15, 2014, by a Second Supplemental Trust Indenture dated as of October 15, 2017, by a Third Supplemental Trust Indenture dated as of June 1, 2019, by a Fourth Supplemental Trust Indenture dated as of November 1, 2020, and by a Fifth Supplemental Trust Indenture to be dated as of February 1, 2022 (as supplemented and amended, the "Trust Indenture"), by and between the City and First Security Bank, Searcy, Arkansas, as trustee (the "Trustee"), a form of which Fifth Supplemental Trust Indenture has been presented to and is before this meeting; and

WHEREAS, an open public hearing on the questions of issuance of the Series 2022 Bonds and the financing of the Project has been held before the Mayor and City Council of the City on May 19, 2022, following publication of a notice of public hearing in *The Baxter Bulletin* on May 5, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the City proposes to enter into a Bond Purchase Agreement (the "Bond Purchase Agreement") in substantially the form presented to and before this meeting, with Crews & Associates, Inc., Little Rock, Arkansas (the "Underwriter"), providing for the sale of the Series 2022 Bonds; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to accept the Underwriter's offer to purchase the Series 2022 Bonds and to authorize the issuance of the Series 2022 Bonds and the delivery and execution of various documents pertaining to the issuance of the Series 2022 Bonds;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MOUNTAIN HOME, ARKANSAS THAT:

- **Section 1**. The City Council hereby finds and declares that the acquisition, construction and equipping of the Project is in the best interest of the City and the customers of the System.
- **Section 2**. Under the authority of the Constitution and laws of the State of Arkansas, including, particularly, Amendment 65 and the Act, there is hereby authorized the issuance of bonds of the City to be designated as "Water and Sewer Revenue Improvement Bonds, Series 2022" (the "Series 2022 Bonds"), for the purposes of (i) financing the Project, (ii) purchasing a policy of municipal bond insurance, (iii) purchasing a policy of municipal bond debt service reserve insurance, and (iv) paying the costs of issuing the Series 2022 Bonds. The Mayor and City

Clerk are hereby authorized to execute and deliver the Series 2022 Bonds to or upon the direction of the Underwriter (hereinafter defined) and in substantially the form thereof included in the Fifth Supplemental Trust Indenture (hereinafter defined) submitted to this meeting, with such changes as shall be approved by such persons executing the Series 2022 Bonds, their execution to constitute conclusive evidence of such approval. The Series 2022 Bonds shall be issued in the original aggregate principal amount of Ten Million Dollars (\$10,000,000), shall mature on the dates and in the amounts, and shall bear interest at the rates, all as specified in the Bond Purchase Agreement and the Fifth Supplemental Trust Indenture presented to this meeting. The Series 2022 Bonds shall be issued in the form and denominations, shall be dated, shall be numbered, shall be subject to optional and mandatory redemption prior to maturity and shall contain such other terms, covenants and conditions, all as set forth in the Fifth Supplemental Trust Indenture presented to this meeting.

The Series 2022 Bonds shall not be general obligations of the City, but shall be special obligations secured by and payable from the revenues of the System on a parity basis with the City's outstanding Series 2017 Bonds and the Series 2020 Bonds.

Section 3. To prescribe the terms and conditions upon which the Series 2022 Bonds are to be executed, authenticated, issued, accepted, held and secured, the Mayor is hereby authorized and directed to execute and acknowledge a Fifth Supplemental Trust Indenture to be dated as of February 1, 2022 (the "Trust Indenture"), by and between the City and First Security Bank, Searcy, Arkansas, as trustee (the "Trustee"), and the City Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to execute and acknowledge the Fifth Supplemental Trust Indenture and to affix the seal of the City thereto, and the Mayor and the City Clerk are hereby authorized and directed to cause the Fifth Supplemental Trust Indenture to be accepted, executed and acknowledged by the Trustee. The Fifth Supplemental Trust Indenture is hereby approved in substantially the form submitted to this meeting, including, without limitation, the provisions thereof pertaining to the pledge of System revenues to the Series 2022 Bonds and the terms of the Series 2022 Bonds. The Mayor is hereby authorized, upon the advice of Kutak Rock LLP ("Bond Counsel"), to confer with the Trustee and the Underwriter (hereinafter defined) in order to complete the Fifth Supplemental Trust Indenture in substantially the form submitted to this meeting, with such changes as shall be approved by such persons executing the Fifth Supplemental Trust Indenture, their execution to constitute conclusive evidence of such approval.

(Advice is given that a copy of the Fifth Supplemental Trust Indenture in substantially the form authorized to be executed is on file with the City Clerk and is available for inspection by any interested person.)

Section 4. The Series 2022 Bonds shall be sold to Crews & Associates, Inc., Little Rock, Arkansas (the "Underwriter"), pursuant to the specific terms and conditions set forth the Fifth Supplemental Trust Indenture and in a Bond Purchase Agreement to be dated as of the date of its execution (the "Bond Purchase Agreement"), by and between the City and the Underwriter, for the purchase price of ______98.625% of the principal amount thereof, [less][plus] net original issue [premium][discount] of \$______95.84.55. The Mayor is hereby authorized and directed to execute a Bond Purchase Agreement on behalf of the City, and the Bond Purchase Agreement is hereby approved in substantially the form submitted to this meeting, and the Mayor is hereby authorized, upon the advice of Bond Counsel, to confer with the Underwriter in order to

complete the Bond Purchase Agreement in substantially the form submitted to this meeting, with such changes as shall be approved by such persons executing the Bond Purchase Agreement, their execution to constitute conclusive evidence of such approval.

(Advice is given that a copy of the Bond Purchase Agreement in substantially the form authorized to be executed is on file with the City Clerk and is available for inspection by any interested person.)

Section 5. There is hereby authorized and approved a Preliminary Official Statement of the City, including the cover page and appendices attached thereto, relating to the Series 2022 Bonds. The previous distribution and use of the Preliminary Official Statement in connection with the offer and sale of the Series 2022 Bonds is hereby ratified. The Preliminary Official Statement is hereby "deemed final" within the meaning of U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission Rule 15c2-12. The Preliminary Official Statement, as amended to conform to the terms of the Bond Purchase Agreement, including Exhibit A thereto, and with such other changes and amendments as are mutually agreed to by the City and the Underwriter, is herein referred to as the "Official Statement," and the Mayor is hereby authorized to execute the Official Statement for and on behalf of the City. The Official Statement is hereby approved in substantially the form of the Preliminary Official Statement submitted to this meeting, and the Mayor is hereby authorized to confer with the Underwriter and Bond Counsel in order to complete the Official Statement in substantially the form of the Preliminary Official Statement submitted to this meeting with such changes as shall be approved by such persons, the Mayor's execution to constitute conclusive evidence of such approval.

(Advice is given that a copy of the Preliminary Official Statement is on file with the City Clerk and is available for inspection by any interested person.)

Section 6. In order to provide for continuing disclosure of certain financial and operating information with respect to the City and the System in compliance with the provisions of Rule 15c2-12 of the U. S. Securities and Exchange Commission, the Mayor is hereby authorized and directed to execute a Continuing Disclosure Agreement to be dated as of the date of its execution (the "Continuing Disclosure Agreement"), by and between the City and First Security Bank, Searcy, Arkansas, as dissemination agent (the "Dissemination Agent"), and the Mayor is hereby authorized and directed to cause the Continuing Disclosure Agreement to be executed by the Dissemination Agent. The Continuing Disclosure Agreement is hereby approved in substantially the form submitted to this meeting, and the Mayor is hereby authorized to confer, upon the advice of Bond Counsel, with the Dissemination Agent and the Underwriter in order to complete the Continuing Disclosure Agreement in substantially the form submitted to this meeting, with such changes as shall be approved by such persons executing the Continuing Disclosure Agreement, their execution to constitute conclusive evidence of such approval.

(Advice is given that a copy of the Continuing Disclosure Agreement in substantially the form authorized to be executed is on file with the City Clerk and is available for inspection by any interested person.)

Section 7. (a) In order to secure lower interest rates on the Series 2022 Bonds, the Underwriter has proposed that the City consider the purchase of a policy of bond insurance with a

portion of the proceeds of the Series 2022 Bonds, which policy would guarantee the payment of the principal of and interest on the Series 2022 Bonds when due. Upon a determination that such a purchase would be economically advantageous, the Mayor has executed an insurance commitment with Build America Mutual Assurance Company ("BAM") for the delivery of a municipal bond insurance policy (the "Bond Insurance Policy") with respect to the Series 2022 Bonds. The execution of such commitment by the Mayor is hereby ratified, and the Mayor is further authorized to do any and all things necessary to accomplish the delivery of the Bond Insurance Policy.

- (b) In order to enhance the amount of proceeds of the Series 2022 Bonds available to pay costs of the Project described above, the Underwriter has proposed that the City consider the purchase of a municipal bond debt service reserve insurance policy with a portion of the proceeds of the Series 2022 Bonds, which policy would satisfy the funding requirements of the debt service reserve described in the Fifth Supplemental Trust Indenture. Upon a determination that such a purchase would be economically advantageous, the Mayor has executed an insurance commitment with BAM for the delivery of a municipal bond debt service reserve insurance policy (the "Reserve Policy") for deposit in the debt service reserve fund for the Series 2022 Bonds. The execution of such commitment by the Mayor is hereby ratified, and the Mayor is further authorized to do any and all things necessary to accomplish the delivery of the Reserve Policy.
- **Section 8.** The Mayor and City Clerk, for and on behalf of the City, are hereby authorized and directed to do any and all things necessary to effect the issuance, sale, execution and delivery of the Series 2022 Bonds, and to effect the execution and delivery of the Fifth Supplemental Trust Indenture, the Bond Purchase Agreement, the Official Statement, the Continuing Disclosure Agreement and a Tax Compliance Agreement relating to the tax exemption of interest on the Series 2022 Bonds, and to perform all of the obligations of the City under and pursuant thereto. The Mayor and the City Clerk are further authorized and directed, for and on behalf of the City, to execute all papers, documents, certificates and other instruments that may be required for the carrying out of such authority or to evidence the exercise thereof.
- **Section 9.** The rates for water and sewer services of the System previously enacted pursuant to Ordinance No. 2021-21, Ordinance No. 2022-19 and Ordinance No. 2022-20 are hereby ratified and confirmed.
- **Section 10.** The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable, and if any section, phrase or provision shall for any reason be declared to be illegal or invalid, such declaration shall not affect the validity of the remainder of the sections, phrases or provisions of this Ordinance.
- **Section 11.** All ordinances, resolutions and parts thereof in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 12. It is hereby found and determined that there is an urgent need to finance certain betterments and improvements to the wastewater treatment component of the System in order to alleviate hardships to the residents of the City, and in order to do so on the most favorable terms, it is necessary to enter into the Bond Purchase Agreement as soon as possible. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Ordinance, being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety and welfare, shall be in force and take effect immediately upon and after its passage and approval.

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AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CONTRACTED WATER RATES BETWEEN THE CITY OF MOUNTAIN HOME WATER DEPARTMENT AND WHOLESALE PURCHASERS – AS OUTLINED IN ORDINANCE NO. 599 SECTION 8 AS AMENDED BY ORDINANCE NO. 01-21, 03-12, 2005-42, 2006-28, 2007-24, 2008-21, 2009-13, 2010-22, 2011-10, 2012-6, 2013-7, 2014-11, 2016-13 & 2019-28, 2020-32, 2021-21.

WHEREAS, it is determined by the City Council of Mountain Home, Arkansas that current or existing charges do not reflect the actual costs of service; and

WHEREAS, after reviewing the year ending 2021 audit, the City Council finds that an adjustment is necessary.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF MOUNTAIN HOME, ARKANSAS:

SECTION 1. Wholesale Charges

- **A.** Wholesale customers charge from the water plant is \$4.49 per 1,000 gallons.
- **B.** Wholesale customers charge from the 960-elevation system is \$5.01 per 1,000 gallons.
- C. Wholesale customers charge from the 1,080-elevation system is \$5.24 per 1,000 gallons.

SECTION 2. Wholesale Reservation

A. The City of Mountain Home does notwithstanding the provisions of this chapter, reserve the right and responsibility to determine wholesale water rates for water supplied for resale to and used by large consumers, including but not limited to governmental units, water associations and improvement districts. Such wholesale rates shall be set and established from time to time as necessary by agreement and contract with any such entity and by Ordinance of the City of Mountain Home, Arkansas. (Ord. 599 Sec. 8)

- Wholesale water sales from the plant increased approximately 11.8%.
- Wholesale water sale from the 960 system was zero for 2021.
- Wholesale water sales from the 1080 system increased approximately 7.3%.

Over the same period:

- O&M costs increased approximately 9.6%.
- Interest expense decreased approximately 53.6%.
- Depreciation expense increased approximately 0.6%.

The decrease in interest expense is the major factor resulting in the change (decrease) in the wholesale rates.

ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE PARKING OF VEHICLES ON UNIMPROVED SURFACES AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

I. DEFINITIONS:

- A. As used herein the following terms shall be defined as follows:
- 1) "Building line" means a line parallel or approximately parallel to the street line and beyond which, buildings or fences may not be erected.
- 2) "Corner lot" means a residential property located at the intersection or confluence of two or more streets such that public street rights-of-way are directly adjacent to at least two contiguous sides of the lot.
- 3) "Driveway" means the primary improved or unimproved parking surface which provides egress and ingress from a garage, carport or off-street parking area to an adjacent street or alley.
- 4) "Front yard" means the area from the front face of a residential structure to the front property line or street right-of-way line or, when a structure does not exist, the area from the front building line to the front property line or street right-of-way.
- 5) "Improved parking surface" means an area used for the parking or storage of vehicles that is overlaid or otherwise paved with concrete, asphault, paving stones or other hard surfaced durable material approved by the building official.
- 6) "Rear yard" means the area from the rear face of a residential structure to the rear property line.
- 7) "Side yard" means the area from the side of a residential structure to the side property line.
- 8) "Vehicle" means every device in, upon or by which any person or property is or may be transported or drawn or moved upon a street, highway, waterway or airway and shall include any automobile, bus, truck, tractor, motor house, farm machinery, motorcycles, scooters, mopeds, all-terrain vehicles, boats, aircraft, recreational vehicles, golf carts, go-carts, trailers, fifth wheel trailers, campers, camper shells, wheeled towing frames, semi-tractor trailers,

truck beds mounted on chassis and mobile homes. This definition does not include non-motorized bicycles, small engine lawnmowers and devices of similar scale.

II. REGULATIONS:

- (A) Parking on unimproved surfaces restricted.
- (1) A person commits an offense if, upon a residential single-family, duplex or townhouse lot or tract:
- a. The person causes, permits or allows the parking or storage of any vehicle in the front yard upon any surface other than an improved parking surface.
- b. The person causes, permits or allows the parking or storage of any vehicle upon the side yard or rear yard of a corner lot upon any surface other than an improved parking surface, unless otherwise concealed from view from all public street rights-of-way by:
 - i) A solid, opaque, screening fence or wall at least six feet in height;
- ii) Vegetation consisting of a solid hedgerow of evergreen shrubs, or trees and shrubs, providing full screening from the ground to a minimum heigh of six feet;
- iii) Any combination of the above that effectively conceals the vehicle from view and accomplishes the required screening height; or
- iv) Any other form of compatible and appropriate screening approved by the building official.
- (2) No driveway or improved parking surface shall cover more than 50 percent of a residential front yard.
- (3) It is an affirmative defense to prosecution for parking or storing vehicles on an unimproved surface or in an unconcealed or unscreened manner if such vehicles are parked in the rear yard and the rear yard is not a corner lot or directly adjacent to a public street right-of-way.

III. MAINTENANCE:

(A) All improved parking surfaces shall be maintained in good and safe condition and be free of holes, cracks or other failures that may affect the use, safety, appearance or drainage of the surface or of an adjoining property.

IV. PENALTIES:

(A) Any person or ownership entity violating the terms of this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor with each day of violation being deemed a separate offense. The fine for each violation shall be not less than \$50.00 nor more than \$500.00.

V. REPEALING CLAUSE:

(A) Any Ordinances in conflict with the terms of this Ordinance shall be repealed to the extent of such conflict.

ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING UNSANITARY CONDITIONS WITHIN THE CITY OF MOUNTAIN HOME

I. DEFINITIONS:

- A. The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this article, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:
- 1) "Garbage" means all normal kitchen waste, such as vegetable and animal wastes and their byproducts, but does not include sewage and human body wastes.
- 2) "Rubbish" means brush, grass, and other normal yard refuse, paper, cans, bottles and empty food and drink containers.
- 3) "Things" mean, but are not limited to, the following items: inoperative motor vehicles and boats, inoperative household or commercial appliances, furniture, building materials, building rubbish, human or animal excrement, metal, plastic or paper containers.
- 4) "Abandoned" means that property to which no person claims or exercises the rights of ownership.
- 5) "Appliances" means, but is not limited to, refrigerators, deep freezes, stoves, ovens, air conditioners, washers, dryers, trash compactors, dishwashers, televisions, radios, hot water heaters and plumbing fixtures.
- 6) "Building Material" means, but is not limited to, items such as boards, bricks, cement, nails, pipe, sheet metal, siding, tar paper and windows which have never been incorporated into a structure or which have been removed from a structure and may be readily incorporated into another structure. This article applies only to building material which lies in public view and with respect to which its owner has no definite immediate plans for its use.
- 7) "Building Rubbish" means any postconstruction solid waste which, because of its quantity, quality or condition, cannot be readily and immediately put to a beneficial use.

- 8) "Inoperative" means an item which, by mechanical or physical defect, can no longer be used for its intended purpose and which is not serving a functional purpose. Inoperative, when applied to motor vehicles or boats, refers to any motor vehicle or boat which is inoperable, dismantled, damaged or is unable to start or move under its own power. A vehicle shall be presumed to be inoperative when:
 - a. It has not been moved for more than ten days;
 - b. One or more tires are flat:
 - c. One or more wheels are missing;
 - d. The hood or trunk is raised or missing and has appeared to remain so for more than three days;
 - e. Weeds or grass have grown up around the vehicle;
 - f. The engine is missing;
 - g. The vehicle has no current vehicle tags or registration;
 - h. The doors or fenders are removed or missing; or
 - i. The front or rear windshield is broken, removed or missing, or the side windows are broken or removed or missing.

A boat shall be presumed inoperable when:

- a. It does not appear to be operational.
- b. The boat has no current registration.
- 9) "Motor Vehicle" means every device capable of being moved upon a public highway and in, upon or by which any person or property is or may be transported or drawn upon a public highway, excepting devices moved by human or animal power or used exclusively upon stationary rails or tracks.
- 10) "Unsanitary" means that a place, condition or thing is unsanitary when it might become a breeding place for flies, mosquitoes and germs harmful to the health of the community.
- 11) "Unsightly" means that a place, condition or thing is unsightly when it is in public view and offends the then-prevailing standard of the community as a whole, and not limited to a specific area, as to aesthetics or order.
- 12) "Weeds" means any vegetation, lush or decayed, regardless of its beauty or utility and regardless of the fact that it might serve as a sanctuary for animals beneficial to man, which, because of its natural condition or lack of maintenance by the owner or occupant of the property, threatens the health or safety of the community or creates an unsightly condition thereon.

II. ABATEMENT OF UNSIGHTLY OR UNSANITARY CONDITIONS ON REAL PROPERTY:

- (A) Owners or occupants of real property within the corporate limits of the city are hereby required to cut grass and weeds; they shall not exceed 9 inches in height, remove garbage, rubbish, inoperative motor vehicles, boats or other unsightly or unsanitary things; and eliminate, fill up or remove stagnant pools of water or any other unsanitary thing, place or condition upon their real property.
- (B) It shall be unlawful for the owner or occupant of real property to permit the accumulation or development of weeds, garbage, rubbish, inoperative motor vehicles, boats or other unsightly or unsanitary things or conditions on real property within the city.

III. ABATEMENT OF UNSIGHTLY OR UNSANITARY CONDITIONS ON REAL PROPERTY WHICH CREATE AN IMMINENT HEALTH OR SAFETY HAZARD:

- (A) Whenever a real and imminent health or safety hazard stemming from a condition or thing described exists such that the notice provisions provided for cannot be complied with without jeopardizing the health and safety of the community, the city shall give notice, as is practical under the circumstances, to the affected property owner. If the property owner does not act immediately to correct the condition or thing complained of, the city shall, pursuant to A.C.A. § 14-54-103 do whatever is necessary to abate the hazard stemming from the condition or thing.
- (B) Alternate procedure. Upon the written application of two or more of the individuals described in this section, the city attorney is authorized to immediately seek a temporary restraining order or preliminary injunction regarding the condition or thing complained of. The initial determination of what condition or thing constitutes a real and imminent health or safety hazard must be made by at least two of the following individuals: the mayor, the county health officer, the fire chief, the assistant fire chief, police chief, the assistant police chief, and the city inspector. If three of the above individuals agree that a real and imminent health or safety hazard does not exist, no action shall be taken under this section. If the named individuals are equally divided in their opinions, action may be taken under this section. It is not necessary that all of the named individuals participate in the determination.

IV. LIEN AGAINST REAL PROPERTY/NOTICE FOR ABANDONED, INOPERABLE VEHICLE:

(A) If the owner or occupant of any real property within the corporative limits of the city neglects or refuses, after being given seven days' written notice by the mayor or his designee to remove, abate or eliminate any condition, the city

will do whatever is necessary to correct the condition and will charge the cost of the correction to the property owner to secure its costs; the city will perfect a lien against the affected property pursuant to A.C.A. § 14-54-903 et seq. A.C.A. § 14-54-901 et seq. is hereby adopted by reference as if set out word for word herein.

(B) Before any abandoned or inoperative motor vehicle or boat is taken into custody and possession from private property, the city shall give the private property owner or occupant and the owner of the motor vehicle, if ascertainable, 30 days' notice by registered or certified mail that such action will be taken unless the motor vehicle is restored to a functional use, disposed of in a manner not prohibited by A.C.A. § 8-6-401 et seq. or placed in an enclosed building. The 30-day notice may be waived by the owner or occupants of the property jointly or severally.

V. NOTICE BY PUBLICATION:

(A) In case the owner is unknown or his whereabouts is not known, a copy of the written notice shall be posted upon the premises; and before any action to enforce the lien shall be had, the clerk-treasurer shall make an affidavit setting out the facts as to the unknown address or whereabouts or non-residence; and, thereupon, service by publication as now provided by law against nonresident defendants may be had, and an attorney ad item shall be appointed to notify the defendant by registered letter addressed to his last known place of residence if it can be found.

VI. PENALTIES:

(A) Any person or ownership entity violating the terms of this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor with each day of violation being deemed a separate offense. The fine for each violation shall be not less than \$50.00 nor more than \$500.00.


