#### MINUTES REGULAR CITY COUNCIL MEETING – Thursday, September 19th, 2024

- 1. The Mountain Home City Council met in regular session on September 19, 2024, in the Council Chambers of the Municipal Building. Mayor Hillrey Adams called the meeting to order at 5 p.m.
- <u>CITY OFFICIALS IN ATTENDANCE</u> Mayor Hillrey Adams, City Clerk Scott Liles, City Attorney Roger Morgan, Treasury Director Alma Clark, Human Resources Director Sue Edwards Strop, Planning Director Arnold Knox, Public Works Director Steve Hill, Police Chief Eddie Griffin, Fire Chief Kris Quick, and Parks Director Daniel Baxley.
- **3.** <u>MEDIA IN ATTENDANCE</u> Caroline Spears of the Baxter Bulletin and Chris Fulton of the Mountain Home Observer. The meeting was also streamed on Facebook by XL-7 TV.
- 4. <u>ROLL CALL</u> Following the Pledge of Allegiance and an invocation, the following Council members were present for the roll call: Susan Stockton, Jennifer Baker, Wayne Almond, Paige Evans, Carry Manuel, Jim Bodenhamer and Nick Reed. Council member Bob Van Haaren was absent.
- APPROVAL OF THE SEPTEMBER 5<sup>th</sup> MINUTES Council member Jennifer Baker made a motion to approve the minutes from the Council's September 5th meeting. The motion was seconded by Council member Wayne Almond. The vote was recorded as follows: Yes

   All present. Absent Bob Van Haaren. The motion carried, and the September 5th minutes were adopted.

#### 6. ANNOUNCEMENTS

**KELLY LEWIS – 25 YEARS OF SERVICE** Mayor Hillrey Adams and Parks Director Daniel Baxley recognized the L.C. Sammons Youth Center's Kelly Lewis for her 25 years of service to the City. In her time with the City, Lewis has served under five mayors and four Parks directors. The Youth Center hosts about 125 kids a day, which means that Lewis has interacted with more than 1 million kids in her time with the Parks Department.

#### 7. <u>NEW BUSINESS</u>

<u>A RESOLUTION LEVYING A 2-MILL PROPERTY TAX FOR THE CITY OF MOUNTAIN HOME</u> <u>ON THE COUNTY COLLECTOR'S BOOKS FOR THE FORTHCOMING YEAR</u> If approved, this Resolution would continue to levy the City's 2-mill property tax for 2024, which would be collected in 2025 when residents pay their property taxes. The City has collected 2 mills in property tax for decades, dating back to the 1980s. Mountain Home's millage is split 60-40 between the General Fund and the Street Department. In 2023, the City collected a total of \$989,453.32 in revenue from its 2-mill property tax. Council member Jennifer Baker made a motion to adopt the Resolution and was seconded by Council member Carry Manuel. The vote was recorded as follows: Yes – All present, Absent – Bob Van Haaren. The Resolution was declared adopted and numbered Resolution No. 2024-25.

#### AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 2023-34, 2023-18, 2022-45, 2022-32, 2022-21 TO EXPAND AND REDEFINE THE JOB CLASSIFICATION AND COMPENSATION PLAN IN ORDER TO ENHANCE EFFICIENT MANAGEMENT WITHIN THE DEPARTMENTS OF

**THE CITY OF MOUNTAIN HOME** If approved, this Ordinance would create new positions in the Parks Department that will be needed when the community center begins operations. The Ordinance would also update the City's job classifications to conform to the Department of Labor's new rules on overtime pay and exempt employees. City attorney Roger Morgan placed the proposed Ordinance on its first reading in its entirety.

**SECOND READING** After the item's first reading, Council member Jennifer Baker made a motion to suspend the rules and place the item on its second reading by title only. That motion was seconded by Council member Carry Manuel. *The vote was recorded as follows: Yes – All present, Absent – Bob Van Haaren. AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 2022-04, 2022-50, 2023-3, AND 2023-44 TO REDEFINE THE WAGE SCALE AND COMPENSATION PLAN IN ORDER TO ENHANCE EFFICIENT MANAGEMENT WITHIN THE DEPARTMENTS OF THE CITY OF MOUNTAIN HOME, ARKANSAS If approved, this Ordinance would update the City's wage scales to reflect the changes to the City's job classifications adopted through Ordinance No. 2024-15. City attorney Roger Morgan placed the item on its first reading in its entirety.

**SECOND READING** After the item's first reading, Council member Carry Manuel made a motion to suspend the rules and place the item on its second reading by title only. <u>UPDATE ON THE NORTH CENTRAL ARKANSAS ECONOMIC ALLIANCE'S WORK ON BEHALF</u> <u>OF THE CITY</u> Mountain Home Area Chamber of Commerce President/CEO Dani Pugsley gave the Council a brief update on the Alliance's economic development work:

**BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT** The City has granted 140 business licenses since January, with those businesses employing 260 workers. The Alliance is currently trying to finalize an agreement with a major retailer and is hoping to make a formal announcement in about 30 days.

**HIGHWAY 412 IMPROVEMENTS** Mountain Home hosted the Arkansas Department of Transportation commissioners last week. The continued expansion of Highway 412 with additional passing lanes is on the commission's radar and is in the works.

**INDUSTRIAL PARK** The Alliance recently completed writing a grant for the Mountain Home Industrial Park. There is now 30 acres of available land in the park, and work continues to secure additional land.

**WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT** Mountain Home will host a workforce development conference on October 18. A grant for workforce development will provide high school students with pre-apprentice work with local trade industries. Twenty additional businesses are needed for Mountain Home to be certified as an ACT Work Ready Community. This program certifies high school students for employment consideration.

**DOWNTOWN PLAN** Mountain Home and Harrison recently received a grant to develop strategic development plans for their downtown areas. Mountain Home's 5-year plan needs "a lot of work." The Chamber has hired a part-time employee, Zachery Woods, to serve as a coordinator of downtown partnerships. The application window to apply for membership to the Downtown USA Arkansas organization opens in the spring, and Woods has been helping the Chamber to possibly prepare to apply for that membership.

#### 8. ADJOURNMENT

With no further business to come before the council, Council member Susan Stockton made a motion to adjourn the meeting and drew a second from Council member Carry

**POLICE/FIRE REPORTS** Fire Chief Kris Quick and Police Chief Eddie Griffin delivered their monthly reports and figures to the Committee.

#### 1. New Fire Department Reporting System

The current reporting system, ESO, is not user-friendly and lacks compatibility. The team is considering switching to a new provider next year after evaluating compatibility.

#### 2. Fire Department Training Sessions

A two-day training session is scheduled for September 28th and 29th, focusing on fire engine training. The training is expected to be beneficial as it was last year.

#### 3. Drug-Free Coalition Grant

The community received a \$625,000 grant over five years to reduce drug misuse among youth through prevention and education. The project will start on October 1st.

#### 4. School Threat Incident

A recent school threat was investigated and found not to be local. The incident required coordination among various departments and highlighted the importance of active shooter training.

#### 5. New Police Department Construction

Construction of the new police department is progressing well, with various trades working on-site. Completion is expected around early spring.



#### 6. Special Response Team Training

The special response team is undergoing tactical training at Camp Robinson, which is expected to benefit all shifts. Plans for more integrated training with military personnel are in place for next year.

#### 7. Fire Department Staffing

There is a need to discuss increasing staff at the fire department to handle medical calls more efficiently. The proposal includes adding three personnel next year.

#### 8. OSHA Regulations on Fire Trucks

Concerns were raised about OSHA regulations requiring fire trucks to be replaced every 15 years. The department is seeking adjustments to these regulations.

- 1. We have gone live with our new reporting system, so far, we think it's ok. We are going to look at another system for next year.
- 2. We have a two-day training come up Sept. 28<sup>th</sup> & 29<sup>th</sup>. A training company from Wichita Kansas is teaching it.
- 3. For the month of August 2024, we had 298 runs, last year August 2023 we had 303. From January – the end of August 2024, we have had 2,362 runs compared to January 2023 – end of August 2023 2,218 runs.




VICINITY MAP (NOT TO SCALE)
