MINUTES PUBLIC HEARING – Thursday, October 3rd, 2024

- 1. The Mountain Home City Council met for a public hearing on the City potentially abandoning a utility easement on October 3, 2024, in the in the Council Chambers of the Municipal Building. Mayor Hillrey Adams called the public hearing to order at 4:55 p.m. Counting Council members, a total of 24 people were in attendance for the hearing.
- **2.** Attorney Ted Sanders appeared on behalf of Gregory DeRose, Jr., and Diane R. DeRose. The DeRoses are petitioning the City to abandon an undeveloped utility easement that runs between Lots 86 and 87 of the Big Creek Phase I subdivision. The DeRoses own both lots and wish to build a residence across both lots.
- **3.** Following Mr. Sanders' presentation, Mayor Adams asked for public comments on the proposed easement abandonment. There was no comment offered by those in attendance.
- **4.** With no further business pending, Mayor Adams adjourned the public hearing at 4:59 p.m. so the Council could proceed with its regular meeting.

MINUTES REGULAR CITY COUNCIL MEETING – Thursday, October 3rd, 2024

- 1. The Mountain Home City Council met in regular session on October 3, 2024, in the Council Chambers of the Municipal Building. Mayor Hillrey Adams called the meeting to order at 5 p.m.
- 2. <u>CITY OFFICIALS IN ATTENDANCE</u> Mayor Hillrey Adams, City Clerk Scott Liles, City Attorney Roger Morgan, Planning Director Arnold Knox, Fire Chief Kris Quick and Parks Director Daniel Baxley.
- **3.** <u>MEDIA IN ATTENDANCE</u> Caroline Spears of the Baxter Bulletin and Chris Fulton of the Mountain Home Observer. The meeting was also streamed on Facebook by XL-7 TV.
- **4. ROLL CALL** Following the Pledge of Allegiance and an invocation, the following Council members were present for the roll call: Susan Stockton, Jennifer Baker, Wayne Almond, Carry Manuel, Jim Bodenhamer and Nick Reed. Council members Bob Van Haaren and Paige Evans were absent.
- 5. <u>APPROVAL OF THE SEPTEMBER 19th MINUTES</u> Council member Jennifer Baker made a motion to approve the minutes from the Council's September 19th meeting. The motion was seconded by Council member Susan Stockton. *The vote was recorded as follows: Yes All present. Absent Bob Van Haaren and Paige Evans. The motion carried, and the September 19th minutes were adopted.*

6. PARK DEPARTMENT AWARDS Mayor Hillrey Adams reported that the City recently attended the Arkansas Recreation and Parks Conference in Jonesboro. At that conference, the City accepted the award for Best Festival (5-10 years old) for the Baxter Summer Music Series and longtime Mountain Home American Legion Coach Lester White was recognized as a Park Champion for his continued work with Cooper Park and the City. Outdoor Natural Resource Programmer Andrew McNair was honored as the 2024 Outstanding New Professional. The Outstanding New Professional Award recognizes a park and recreation professional with a minimum of 3 years and less than 15 years of experience in the field and who possesses the qualities and skills of an emerging leader. The nominee demonstrates outstanding leadership, initiative, innovation, and contribution to the park and recreation profession in Arkansas. Within his/her career, the nominee has shown steady career advancement, a commitment to ongoing professional development, recognition and respect from coworkers and colleagues as an emerging leader, and engagement with community and/or professional organizations.

7. NEW BUSINESS

AN ORDINANCE VACATING A UTILITY EASEMENT LOCATED ON PART OF LOTS 86 AND 87 OF BIG CREEK ESTATES, PHASE 1, WITHIN THE CITY LIMITS OF MOUNTAIN HOME, ARKANSAS The proposed Ordinance was initially presented at the public hearing held immediately prior to the Council meeting. If adopted, it would abandon a utility easement running between Lots 86 and 87 of the Big Creek Phase I subdivision. The two lots are owned by the DeRose family, which wishes to develop a singular property across both lots. The easement in question has not been developed and is not in use at this time. City Attorney Roger Morgan placed the proposed Ordinance on its first reading in its entirety.

SECOND READING After the item's first reading, Council member Jennifer Baker made a motion to suspend the rules and place the item on its second reading by title only. That motion was seconded y Council member Nick Reed. *The vote was recorded as follows: Yes – All present, Absent – Bob Van Haaren and Paige Evans. The motion carried and the proposed Ordinance was read a second time.*

THIRD READING Following the second reading, Council member Jennifer Baker made a motion to suspend the rules and place the item on its third reading by title only and drew a second from Council member Wayne Almond. The vote was recorded as follows: Yes – All present, Absent – Bob Van Haaren and Paige Evans. The motion carried and the proposed Ordinance was read a third time.

ADOPTION Following the item's third reading, Council member Jennifer Baker made a motion to adopt the proposed Ordinance and was seconded by Council member Wayne Almond. The vote was recorded as follows: Yes — All present, Absent — Bob Van Haaren and Paige Evans. The Ordinance was declared adopted and numbered Ordinance No. 2024-17.

CITY CLERK'S NOTE Copies of the maps referenced here, as well as other related documents, are attached to Ordinance No. 2024-17.

<u>COMMUNITY CENTER UPDATE</u> Mayor Hillrey Adams shared two photos and a time-lapse video of the construction work presently being done at the site of the future community center in McCabe Park. The photos were captured by a drone and showed a bird's eye view of the future community center. The video showed construction work on the site from earlier this spring through the first of October. The community center, its indoor pools and the outdoor aquatic center has an estimated completion date of Spring 2026.

8. ADJOURNMENT

With no further business to come before the council, Council member Jennifer Baker made a motion to adjourn the meeting and drew a second from Council member Susan Stockton. A voice vote was recorded as follows: Yes – All present, Absent – Bob Van Haaren and Paige Evans. Mayor Hillrey Adams then declared the meeting adjourned at 5:18 p.m.







RESOLUTION NO. 2024-xx

A RESOLUTION AMENDING THE CITY'S 2024 BUDGET AND ARPA GRANT BUDGET TO APPROPRIATE COSTS

WHEREAS, the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA), which was signed into law in March 2021, provides fiscal recovery funds to local governments; and

WHEREAS, ARPA provides support to local governments in responding to the impact of COVID-19 and in addressing the economy; and

WHEREAS, ARPA created several eligible uses of the funding, including one to address lost revenue for cities and towns; and

WHEREAS, the United States Department of Treasury on January 6, 2022, issued a Final Rule regarding the use of ARPA funds; and

WHEREAS, the Final Rule permits cities and towns to utilize one of the statutorily eligible uses of the funds as "lost revenue or revenue replacement" up to a standard allowance of \$10,000,000 or the total amount of a city's grant award, whichever is less; and

WHEREAS, the total grant award amount for the City of Mountain Home is less than \$10,000,000; and

WHEREAS, the Final Rule permits cities and towns to utilize "lost revenue/ revenue replacement" for <u>any</u> government services.

WHEREAS, the United States Treasury recently clarified via a Final Rule adoption and through FAQ's 17.7 and 17.17 that cities can obligate personnel costs under the Revenue Replacement Eligible Use Category, provided that the ARPA paid positions were established and filled on or before December 31, 2024.

WHEREAS, the City adopted Resolution No. 2023-10 which allocated ARPA "revenue replacement" funding to three water and/or sewer projects. A spreadsheet prepared by the Director Finance & Treasury is attached hereto as Exhibit A. It details the amount originally appropriated for each of the three ARPA funded projects, and the amount of expenditure & total remaining from each of the projects as of October 9, 2024; and

WHEREAS, the American Rescue Plan Act requires that ARPA funds have to be legally "obligated" by December 31, 2024, and in order to readily meet this deadline, the City of Mountain Home will re-allocate remaining ARPA funding from the amounts in Exhibit A, in Column 4 – for the total, (\$1,612,976.94) and instead now allocate the remaining funds for the payment of certain 2024 employee salaries and employer payroll contributions; and,

WHEREAS, the United States Treasury recently clarified via a Final Rule adoption and through its Frequently Answered Questions (FAQ's 17.7 and 17.17) that cities can obligate personnel costs for 2024 under the Revenue Replacement Eligible Use Category, provided that the positions were established and filled on or before December 31, 2024.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MOUNTAIN HOME CITY COUNCIL, THAT:

Section 1. FY24 The City hereby appropriates \$ 1,612,976.94 from the City's remaining ARPA funding to be used as reimbursement to the City's 2024 Water and Sewer System Revenue Bond Fund for the costs of 2024 part-time and full-time salaries (other than elected officials) and employer payroll expenses (including, but not limited to FICA, APERS and other applicable health/dental/vision insurance costs) beginning on January 1, 2024, and running until the total amount is expended. The employee expenses are paid out of the Water and Sewer System Fund checking, then reimbursed by the ARPA Grant Funds until all ARPA Funds have been expended. This has the effect of lowering the 2024 Water and Sewer salaries line items in the total amount of \$ 1,612,976.94 for 2024 and raising the ARPA Grant Fund revenue budget line item by the same amount.

Section 2. The City Council directs the Director Finance & Treasury, in her discretion, to move the remaining unexpended ARPA funds for Section 1 from the SW Sewer Line Extension Checking account \$ 1,512,996.94 & the Hwy 5 Water Sewer Extension Project checking account \$99,980.00 into the Water & Sewer Revenue Bond Fund Checking Account and post a total of \$1,612,976.94 from the two accounts in ARPA Grant Funds line Revenue line item.

Section 3. On the mandatory Annual ARPA Reports, the ARPA expenses shall be all be reported under the Expenditure Category (EC) number 6.1 entitled "Revenue Replacement – Provision of Government Services."
